5	COMMUNITY GROUPS UPDATE:			
	Martin Hare (CMAT)			
	provided an update on the Academy and Sawtry Juniors, and the new			
	3G pitch, will be currently 2 projects – the first one is the reopening of			
	the facilities and the 2 <sup>nd</sup> is the improvement with funding for the 3G			
	pitch on the playing fields and upgrading the current Astro turf pitches			
	with a £1 million fund cost and a timeline expected to be completed			
	by the end of 2023, CIL funding has been received to cover most of			
	the costs, next steps will be to apply to the FA for funding, looking up			
	to £900,000.			
	Once open the new 3G pitches will be open to the general public			
	outside of school hours. They have requested a letter of support from			
	the Parish Council for their application, this was proposed, voted and			
	carried by the council. ( Cllr Martin left the room while this was			
	discussed )			
	Simon from the academy spoke about the positive progress at the			
	school post covid, now organising trips away and the upcoming			
	projects they will be supporting and being involved in, and the			
	upcoming exams of the students planning to stay on in 6 <sup>th</sup> form, there			
	is currently a waiting list for this years group capacity up to 180 per			

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	year.  Academy Leisure – Sarah provided a positive update on the level of memberships increasing, the current timetable is being reviewed to meet needs, Sawtry sports4 all involvement for July events. The main focus will be on the gym and swimming pool, splash swim academy has moved from Hinchingbrooke to Sawtry, which helps with the finance, underpinned by the educational trust, so needs to be cost effective or the debt goes onto the school.  Methodist Church – Liz Coates provided an update – starting to reintroduce face to face seminars now 1 per month was previously held over zoom, working closely with All saints, held the good Friday walk in session which is the first once since covid, so things starting to get back to normal process. Christian Aid week mid may, will host a breakfast fundraiser and holiday club.  Caresco – Liz Coates, provided an update on the minibus appeal ongoing, the old bus is still being repaired and they have leased a new bus for the Autumn, Sawtry cars have been helping out, Initial Target has been reached but with ongoing costs rising, the target has now be raised. Ongoing fundraising activities, Free Easter activities was held. Policies and procedures have been checked and approved.  Foodbank – Liz Coates, the numbers are slowly going up again, but still quite a bit down on the usual donations, with the cost of living and energy crisis this will likely have a big effect.  Litter pickers – Lisa has confirmed that Tom has now left the group, they now have a group of around 28 volunteer members multiple from the same families all helping. They have currently set up a whatsapp group, and they are receiving lots of positive engagement on the Litter pickers facebook page, they are actively trying to cover every single street in Sawtry over a 12 month period. They have received donations for equipment from East Anglia Galvanising, HDC reporting tool for fly tipping, the Co-op will be clearing up its own area. There is still a push for more volunteers to help with the group. There has bee
