District Council – Cllr Martin – Would like to start by echoing the comments made by Cllr Tuplin regarding Rolly Laxton and his incredible 49 years' service to the Parish Council. Planning decisions are now being made by the officers unless the Parish Council object, they are not allowing amendments to applications, they would have to submit a new application. The District Council are looking to increase Council Tax next year by £5, and the green bin charge will come into force. Regarding the Parish Council precept currently residents claiming Universal Credit receive an 80% discount on Council tax from April next year this will increase to 100%, however this will increase the Council tax for everyone else, The Parish Council won't know the effect this will have on the Council Tax increase as the District Council are currently going through the process.</li> <li>2. District and County Council – Cllr Bywater – Would also like to echo the previous nice comments regarding Rolly Laxton. Regarding the Weeds currently in the village which has been a hot topic this year, the County Highways will meet in January to discuss.</li> <li>There are still having issues, have contacted Anglian Water but they are unable to help. District Council are looking to apply to the Government for extra funds to explore the issues of flooding further. Green bin updatedecisions made last week there will be a subscription to pay from April next year, and there will also be an early bird scheme, please check the website</li> </ul>

There is also a new scheme with Garden waste on a 4 week cycle every Saturday, a bin wagon will park up in the village where residents can go and empty their garden waste, handbooks will be handed out when the subscription charge arrives.
